power equals I squared R**

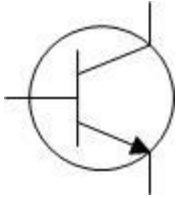
Watts are amps squared times resistance.

WM3PEN

Origination of WM3PEN – The Spirit of '76

The Yankees are coming....The Yankees are coming!
Well not quite. The early 1970s was buzzing with the notion that the Bicentennial of the United States was occurring in 1976. Large celebrations and parades were being set up in Philadelphia.

Amateur Radio was ready for a party. In fact the last ARRL Convention held in Philadelphia was in the 1920s. The Bicentennial Atlantic Division Convention (BARCC) was to be held in July 1976 at the Ben Franklin Hotel on Chestnut St.

BARCC minutes in December 1974 show that W3PST was going to ask Philmont to apply for a special event call (WM3PEN). A contest was held to design the first WM3PEN QSL card. John York, K3GGA, was the winner and the card was set to be used during the convention.

Dave Zimmerman, W3ZD, BARCC Chairman, wrote York "Your design was far and above the outstanding favorite of those voting, and this card may well be the most outstanding QSL card I have ever seen. It is our plan to put your design into print and to send out a good many of them during the Bicentennial year. Your name will be added to the bottom as a credit to the designer."

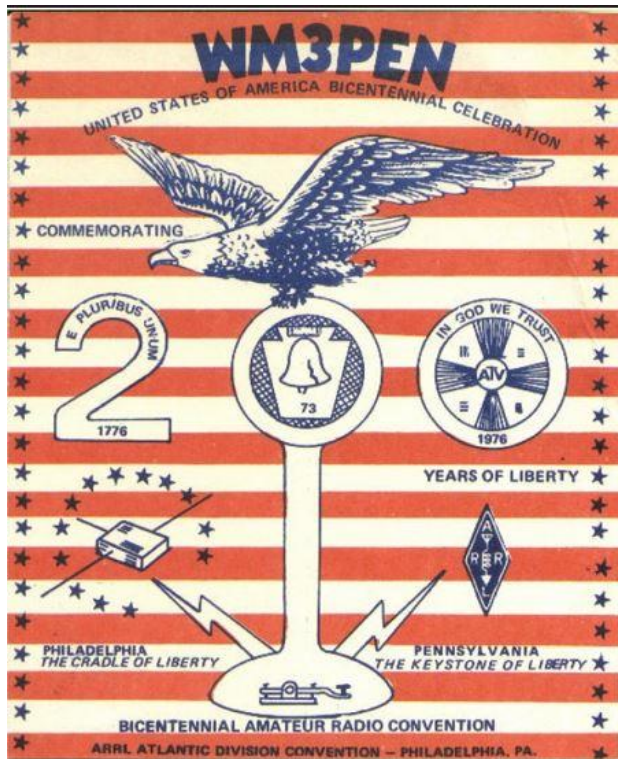
York worked at the Frankford Arsenal in the Publications Division, Fire Control Maintenance Support Directorate. He said he started his design with the number 200 – after that it just evolved as other ideas came to him.

By December, 1975 Dan Sutton, WA3BKR, showed the BARCC Board a mockup of the WM3PEN qsl card. 5000 qsl cards were ordered. One was to be given to each person registering for the convention. Several clubs in the area were given the opportunity to use WM3PEN between June 26 and July 25, 1976. There was even one day that the call was on the air from Independence Mall.

Following the Bicentennial WM3PEN was not available until the mid 1990s when vanity call signs were introduced. Bob, WA3PZO, applied for a Club call in late 1998. HARC was issued KB3DGO. Bob immediately applied for a Vanity Call, WM3PEN, which was issued January 28, 1999.

By 2006 WM3PEN was becoming known to the world as HARC participated in the ARRL **Hello Radio** campaign

which highlighted the fun and friendships of ham radio. In 2011 WM3PEN became a bonus station for the yearly 13 Colonies Special Event. In 2015 WM3PEN joined 4 other special event stations during the Pope's visit to Philadelphia. Since 2011 WM3PEN has made over 85000 contacts. A special qsl card was designed for each year and event.
